Who can participate in the program?

- Youth 15-24 years old
- Have been in the United States for no more than 60 months (5 years)
- New York Residents
- With one of the following immigration Statuses:
 - Refugee
 - An Asylee
 - A Cuban or Haitian Entrant
 - An alien admitted as an Amerasian immigrant
 - A parolee
 - A certified trafficking victim and their derivatives
 - Iraqis and Afghans granted Special Immigrant Status (SIV'S)
 - A Lawful Permanent Resident who previously held one of the above statuses



Does it cost anything to participate?

No, participation in the program is free for anyone who qualifies .

How do I enroll as a participant?

• Participants create an Individualized Connection Plan (ICP) outlining short-term and long-term education, career, and social goals.
